John Hutson lived on Skid Row, NY and was gassed in WWI and never worth much after that. When veterans got a bonus he bought a farm (intersection Old North Point and Millers Island Rds). Farm house is still standing. Family would party every week at this house. John lost the farm and moved back to NY.

Minnie and Guy Perry lived in Pennsylvania and then with Charles Hutson and then in Bungalows.

Uncle John was tall, thin and lived w/Mom L. and Aunt Catherine – didn't talk much – lived in a dump (caretaker) per Anna Smith.
