

Our community retreat ran from June 3-June 7 at Resurrection College in Waterloo. We celebrated our Jubilarians at St. Francis Church in Kitchener on Friday, June 7. Then our Provincial Chapter was held at Resurrection College from June 10-14. Finally, we celebrated Raphael Ma's ordination to priesthood on Saturday, June 14 at St. Mary's Church in Kitchener.

Almost everyone in the Ontario-Kentucky Province was able to make the community retreat. One of our directional statements from the last Provincial Chapter was to educate ourselves about three documents of Pope Francis— *Evangelii Gaudium, Laudato Si', and Amoris Laetitia*—with the intention of





implementing them in our ministry. Previous retreats focused on the first two documents. Fr. David Perrin, a priest of the Diocese of Hamilton, Ontario gave input during the retreat and presided and preached at the Eucharists during the week.



The Ontario-Kentucky Provincial Chapter brought us together to assess how well we responded to our ten directional statements from the Provincial Chapter of 2016 and to plan for the next three years. The Chapter meetings were part of the week that included morning and evening prayer and Eucharist each day, as well as good meals in the Manor dining room and a social each evening. We had a very good Chapter Planning Committee, chaired by Fr. Sam Restivo, C.R. Other members of the committee were Fr. Toby Collins, C.R., Fr. Paul Szymanowski, C.R., Fr.
