



For this blog, I want to turn back the clock a bit. After spending my initial time in Morogoro, Fr. Andrzej and I travelled to Butiama and Buhemba in September to get ready for the beginning of the novitiate. In Blogs #22 and #23, I provided some photos and information about the parish that Fr. Daniel serves at in Butiama. But, I still have not had a chance to provide some photos and information about the parish that Fr. Maciej serves at in Buhemba. So, here we go!



St. John Paull II Parish was inaugurated on Christ the King Sunday, November 22, 2015. This new parish covers a territory of about 100 square kilometers and comprises six villages. In addition to the main church, there are smaller churches at the various "outstations" and an elementary school that is adding a new grade each year. Fr. Maciej Braun, C.R. was designated the first pastor of the new parish by the local diocesan Bishop, Michael Msonganzila of Musoma at a celebration that

spanned three days and included the blessing of two marriages, the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for 92 candidates, and the consecration of the church, which included the imbedding of relics of the Ugandan martyrs in the altar.

Off to the side is the rectory (on the left) and the building for the novitiate (on the left). This is where Fr. Andrzej is directing our ten Tanzanian novices now. Below is the dining room for the novices.



One of the amazing accomplishments of Fr. Maciej is the elementary school. He now has three buses that pick up children who live at a distance too far to walk to school. The school is pictured below the photo of the buses.










You can easily forget how little the children are until you see the desks...and, of course, the children!
