## ORGANIZATION, AMOUNT and DESCRIPTION

## **Arundel Habitat for Humanity - July - \$1,772.95**

Ecumenical Christian organization builds or renovates houses in partnership with needy low-income families in Anne Arundel County. Sold with no profit and zero interest mortgage.

## Sarah's House School Supply Drive - August - \$1,949.08

Funds collected help defray school related costs, such as Weekly Reader subscriptions, field trip expenses, locks, school project supplies, gym uniforms, etc.

## Our Lady of the Visitation, Haiti - September - \$1,848.05

Our sister parish in the Diocese of Gonaives, Haiti.

#### Bello Machre, Inc. - October - \$801.00

Is a non-profit organization which provides loving care and creates opportunities for children and adults with development disabilities to live and work as independently as possible.

## Opportunity Builders, Inc. - October - \$801.00

A non-profit organization that provides training and services to adults with developmental disabilities who live in Anne Arundel County and adjacent communities. The training is to help the adults function and pay their way in the community.

## Joseph Richey Hospice - November - \$785.27

Provides 12 bed residential round the clock professional nursing, psychosocial, and spiritual care as well as home care for terminally ill cancer and AIDS patients in the Baltimore area.

## Hospice of the Chesapeake - November - \$785.27

Is a not-for-profit, non-sectarian, community-based organization that has since 1979, provided care for terminally ill adults and children and families without regard to race, creed, or ability to pay.

#### Interfaith Housing of Western Maryland - December - \$2,090.48

An organization of caring faith communities in the five counties of Western Maryland, whose objectives are to develop affordable housing for low- and moderate-income persons, create jobs and strengthen the region's economy.

# Franciscan Center - January - \$1,001.96

Emergency outreach serving Baltimore poor and homeless for 32 years. Programs include; lunch, clothing, food pantry, counseling and advocacy.

#### Marian House - January - \$1,001.96

A residential counseling and employment program for homeless women, providing personal and employment counseling to over 350 women and their families each year.

## Catholic Relief Services - February - \$849.65

Monies to help Catholic Relief Services staff provide food, clean water, shelter and more to those in El Salvador and India who have seen their lives absolutely devastated.

#### **International Rescue Committee - February - \$849.65**

Provides food, shelter, emergency relief/medical, educational, and resettlement services for refugees in Africa, Asia, and Central America who flee persecution, terror, famine, and war.

## AIDS Interfaith Network of Central Maryland - March - \$1,032.63

Provides the costs of funeral services and burial for those that cannot afford it.

## Redemptorists' AIDS Ministry in Thailand - March - \$1,032.63

Several projects to help women and children affected by HIV and AIDS. A home for healthy children whose parents have either abandoned them or had died from AIDS. A hospice program providing a safe and caring for children dying of AIDS. A training center for women affected by HIV or AIDS providing job training and where they can receive proper nutrition and medications.

## VOICA/Canossian International Volunteer Service - April - \$1,638.23

Lay volunteers who will provide educational and catechetical services as well as health services which focus on marginalized women and children.

#### Mary's Pence - May -\$1,780.56

The mission is to recognize and support the work of Catholic women, both lay and religious, who minister to the economically poor throughout the Americas and who are without access to traditional sources of funding from government, church, or foundation sources.

#### Diocese of Marthandam, India - June - \$1,793.64

This mission diocese founded in 1997, is in the southern part of India and is very economically and educationally deprived. Funds will help provide support for 52 seminarians, help support orphanages and homes for the aged, plus help with building schools.
