Justice and Peace Sharing Fund July 2013 - June 2014

Habitat for Humanity of the Chesapeake - \$1,163.40 - July 2013

Ecumenical Christian organization builds or renovates houses in partnership with needy low-income families in Anne Arundel County. Sold with no profit and zero interest mortgage.

Interfaith Housing Alliance (Western Maryland) - \$1,163.39 - July 2013

An organization of caring faith communities in the five counties of Western Maryland, whose objectives are to develop affordable housing for low- and moderate-income persons, create jobs and strengthen the region's economy.

Sarah's House School Supplies - \$2,127.37 - August 2013

Funds collected help defray school related costs, such as Weekly Reader subscriptions, field trip expenses, locks, school project supplies, gym uniforms, etc.

Our Lady of the Visitation, Gonaives, Haiti - \$2,891.13 - September 2013

Our sister parish in the Diocese of Gonaives, Haiti.

Bello Machre, Inc. - \$809.17 - October 2013

A non-profit organization which provides loving care and creates opportunities for children and adults with development disabilities to live and work as independently as possible.

Opportunity Builders Inc. - \$809.16 - October 2013

A non-profit organization providing training and services to adults with developmental disabilities living in Anne Arundel County and adjacent communities. The training is to help the adults function and pay their way in the community.

The ARC of Anne Arundel County - \$809.17 - October 2013

Serves over 450 people with mental retardation. Supported living, residential services, family services, respite, advocacy and volunteer opportunities.

Anne Arundel County Food Bank - \$1,455.43 - November 2013

Distributes food to food pantries and soup kitchens through the county so the organizations can feed the hungry. Also distributes furniture and other household items to clients through referrals from the Department of Social Services

Maryland Food Bank - \$1,455.43 - November 2013

Distributes food donated from the food industry and food drives to food providers so these organizations can feed hungry Marylanders.

Food for the Poor - \$1,334,35 - December 2013

Collects and distributes food, clothing, money, and supplies to indigent persons throughout the world to improve their health, economic, and social conditions.

International Rescue Committee - \$1,334.35 - December 2013

Provides food, shelter, emergency relief/medical, educational, and resettlement services for refugees in Africa, Asia, and Central America who flee persecution, terror, famine, and war.

Project PLASE - \$1,341.95 - January 2014

Project PLASE (People Lacking Ample Shelter and Employment) began in 1973 to address and remedy the absence of services and resources available to Baltimore's most needy citizens.

My Sister's Place Women Center - \$1,341.95 - January 2014

My Sister's Place Women's Center serves women, and their children in need in Baltimore City by providing 3 meals a day and access to services such as case management, education, and job training.

Sisters Academy - \$896.13 - February 2014

The Catholic middle school for girls opened its doors in September 2004. Sisters Academy is sponsored by the School Sisters of Notre Dame, the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, the Religious Sisters of Mercy and the Sisters on Bon Secours. The academy is modeled on the national Nativity School movement, which focuses on providing high-quality, tuition-free, value-centered education in low-income communities.

St. Frances Academy - \$896.14 - February 2014

The country's oldest African-American Catholic high school run by the Oblate Sisters of Providence, located in Baltimore City. 95% of graduates go on to college and students tutor public school students in the neighborhood, and provide services for senior citizens.

St. Ignatius Loyola - \$896.13 - February 2014

A high school celebrating its tenth anniversary in educating boys from the most challenged neighborhoods in Baltimore City, giving them the opportunity to become "Men for Others" in the Jesuit tradition and giving them an education that could change their lives.

St. Bernadette Youth Work Camp - \$2,368.35 - March 2014

Youth from the parish went to Baltimore City and Terra Alta, West Virginia, where they will work making repairs to the homes of residents who cannot afford to make the repairs.

Doctors without Borders - \$1,377.52 - April 2014

Doctors without Borders was founded in 1971 in France by a group of doctors and journalists in the wake of war and famine in Biafra. Their aim was to establish an independent organization that focuses on delivering emergency medicine aid quickly, effectively and impartially.

Mercy Medical Mission - \$1,377.53 - April 2014

Sister of Mercy Karen Schneider, R.S.M., M.D., teaches and practices pediatric emergency medicine at The Johns Hopkins Children's Center in Baltimore, but four times a year, in a unique partnership between her life as a sister and her work as a medical professor, she takes pediatric residents from Hopkins to third-world countries to learn that same lesson.

Mary's Pence - \$1,327.50 - May 2014

The mission is to recognize and support the work of Catholic women, both lay and religious, who minister to the economically poor throughout the Americas and who are without access to traditional sources of funding from government, church, or foundation sources.

Salvadoran Enterprises for Women (SEW), Inc. - \$1,327.50 - May 2014

Providing meaningful employment for women in El Salvador by building and managing the financial resources, community networks, solidarity efforts, and the U.S. and Salvadoran markets that facilitate new and help expand existing opportunities.

Asylee Women Enterprises (AWE) - \$1,233.75 - June 2014

Asylee Women Enterprise (AWE) provides transitional housing to women seeking asylum. Housing is one of

the biggest obstacles for women seeking asylum. In order to be able to rebuild their lives and their spirit we all must have a safe and nurturing home.

The Baltimore Station - \$1,233.75 - June 2014

Over 144 men are turning their lives around at The Baltimore Station. 80% of our residents are veterans. 70 percent graduate from The Baltimore Station and go onto lead a life free of drugs and/or alcohol.

Camp GLOW - \$150

Camp GLOW (God Loves Our World) is a week-long residential summer camp for adults with disabilities held at the Monsignor O'Dwyer Retreat Center in Sparks, MD

Camp St. Vincent - \$200

Is a free summer day camp that hosts 625 children from low-income families each summer. Children age 6 to 10 are given the opportunity to share in a rare experience for urban area youth- the joys of two weeks at summer camp in the open space and fresh air of the countryside. The children also participate in daily Values Development Lessons, which strive to boost self-esteem, teach the children to resist negative peer pressure.

Catholic Medical Mission Board - \$300

Rooted in the healing ministry of Jesus, works collaboratively to provide quality health care programs and services without discrimination, to people in need throughout the world.

Fonkoze - \$300

It is Haiti's Alternative Bank for the Organized Poor. It is the largest micro-finance institution offering a full range of financial services to the rural-based poor in Haiti. Fonkoze is committed to the economic and social improvement of people and communities of Haiti and to the reduction of poverty in the country.

Julie Community Center - \$150

A multi-purpose, non-profit community organization involved in advocacy, education, and organizing, with special dedication to the poor. Provides after school program, youth enrichment and summer camp program from children ages 6-12. Provides leadership workshops and public health projects for teens.

Murphy Initiative for Justice and Peace - \$150

The P. Francis Murphy Justice and Peace Initiative (PFMjpi) is envisioned as a common voice of member religious communities to work collaboratively for social justice and to support and supplement the ongoing justice and peace work within each community.

Parish Twinning Program - \$300

An organization that links parishes in the U.S. with those in Haiti. Facilitates communications between the parishes and coordinates the shipments of cargo containers of supplies.

Partners in Care - \$300

Partners in Care is a service credit exchange program designed to create community by linking frail elderly and

disabled adults with neighbors who volunteer their time to help with occasional tasks and errands. The goal of these services is to help seniors and disabled adults remain independent in their own homes.
