### 1991 - 1992

The Social Concerns Committee met on November 11, 1991, to review the numerous requests for assistance received and to dispense part of its Peace and Justice Sharing Fund. The following organizations were designated to receive funds from the Sharing Fund.

#### **Arundel Habitat for Humanity**

\$200

Monies help fund construction and rehabilitation of homes for the working poor in Anne Arundel County.

#### Center for the Prevention of Sexual and

**Domestic Violence** 

\$200

Monies help the center to continue the work of training clergy and lay leaders to deal sexual and domestic violence, provide individuals with skills to avoid becoming victims, and promote legal and ethical justice for all who are affected by abuse.

Christ House \$300

Monies help this organization treat homeless sick men and find new living arrangements for them.

#### Franciscan Center, Inc,

\$300

Monies go to support the center's emergency services, food and clothing program, as well as, their AIDS outreach program and adult literacy program.

Marian House \$300

Monies help support a transitional shelter and job training for women returning to independence.

# **Maryland Food Committee**

\$500

Monies go to help feed over 125,000 Maryland children who regularly go to school without breakfast, go to bed hungry, and skip meals an average 7 days each month.

SHARE(Salvadoran Humanitarian Aid, Research, and Education) Foundation \$200

Monies to be used for the prevention and treatment of cholera in El Salvador.

Shepherd's Clinic \$300

Monies help the clinic provide the working poor basic medical care they could not otherwise afford; they don't get company health insurance, can't afford their own and aren't poor enough to qualify for Medicaid or other public health services.

United Farm Workers \$ 100

Monies would go to help appeal to the California Supreme Court a \$1.7 million judgment against the union that helps organize the field workers against the exploitation by the growers.
