## **ORGANIZATION AND DESCRIPTION**

#### Arundel Habitat for Humanity - \$1,366.31 - July 1997

Ecumenical Christian organization builds or renovates houses in partnership with needy low-income families in Anne Arundel County. Sold with no profit and zero interest mortgage.

#### Hospice of the Chesapeake - \$1,260.07 - August 1997

Is a not-for-profit, non-sectarian, community-based organization that has since 1979, provided care for terminally ill adults and children and families without regard to race, creed, or ability to pay.

## Our Lady of the Visitation, Haiti - \$1,394.17 - September 1997

Our sister parish in the Diocese of Gonaives, Haiti.

#### AIDS Interfaith Network of Central Maryland - \$663.48 - October 1997

Provides the costs of funeral services and burial for those that cannot afford it; spiritual support groups; prayer services and continuing education services.

#### Bello Machre - \$663.49 - October 1997

Is a non-profit organization which provides loving care and creates opportunities for children and adults with development disabilities to live and work as independently as possible.

## Joseph Richey Hospice - \$1,246.37 - November 1997

Provides 12 bed residential round the clock professional nursing, psychosocial, and spiritual care as well as home care for terminally ill cancer and AIDS patients in the Baltimore area.

#### Marian House - \$1,349.79 - December 1997

A residential counseling and employment program for homeless women, providing personal and employment counseling to over 350 women and their families each year.

#### Food for the Poor - \$1,718.94 - January 1998

Collects and distributes food, clothing, money, and supplies to indigent persons throughout the world to improve their health, economic, and social conditions.

#### Christopher Place Employment Academy - \$914.95 - February 1998

An employment academy with a residential component supporting addiction recovery. Maximum of 32 men participate at one time over a 12 month period.

# Our Daily Bread - \$914.94 - February 1998

Is committed to providing hospitality to those whose lives are burdened by the hardships of human conditions, especially poverty and homelessness.

## Opportunity Builders - \$975.50 - March 1998

A non-profit organization that provides training and services to adults with developmental disabilities who live in Anne Arundel County and adjacent communities. The training is to help the adults function and pay their way in the community.

#### Sister M Justa Walton Fund - \$487.75 - March 1998

Funds programs for children and adults with mental retardation, from religious education programs to camping experiences at Camp GLOW.

# Center for the Prevention of Sexual Abuse and Domestic Violence - \$668.56 - April 1998

Prevention of child abuse and domestic violence is at the heart of this interreligious organization which trains religious communities nationwide

#### Sexual Minority Youth Assistance League (SYMAL) - \$668.56 - April 1998

SMYAL provides comprehensive support services to gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender youth ages 13-21; and professional training and development to other social service providers.

## Interfaith Housing of Western Maryland - \$1,326.46 - May 1998

An organization of caring faith communities in the five counties of Western Maryland, whose objectives are to develop affordable housing for low- and moderate-income persons, create jobs and strengthen the region's economy.

#### Haiti Twinning Program - \$642.31 - June 1998

Began in 1978 when St. Henry's Parish in Nashville responded to the needs of a remote village in northwest Haiti, where hundreds died of starvation due to five years of drought. Since 1978 this program has helped many parishes in the US twin with a sister parish in Haiti.

#### Opportunity International - \$642.30 - June 1998

Provides small business opportunities and self-sufficiency for individuals, their families and communities of the Third World.
