

She sought shelter in an abandoned car at night and roamed the streets by day. On the streets, she heard about the Winter Relief program and came to seek assistance at Arundel House of Hope. Through the support services provided to her, she has been able to obtain an apartment and is back on her feet. In her own words, "Arundel House of Hope provided me with the support I needed when I was in a bad situation. Their support has been breathtaking. I was provided shelter and food when I was in need. I am now able to live on my own. It is the strength of the staff (and Volunteers) who worked together as a team that enabled me to have a much better life. I have everlasting friends at AHOH. The case workers have helped me develop an amazing resume and I look forward to finding employment in the near future."

The Mission of Winter Relief

For our Guests: To keep those experiencing homelessness in the Baltimore/Annapolis corridor from freezing to death during the winter months and to show them the Divine's love in simple practical ways during our time together.

For our Volunteers: To share with them the blessing of a broader, deeper faith through serving society's least, last, and lost.

This season we expanded our program through the addition of a stand-alone Intake Center in Annapolis. Looking forward, we continue to seek additional organizations to participate in our program, either as a hosting site or in partnership with other hosting sites. This summer we will get the shower trailer back in operation, update the WR handbook and develop training programs for both site and segment coordinators. We continue to see increased usage of support services provided to our guests at AHOH – including case management, medical care, recovery support services, literacy training, workforce development and transitional employment.





Number of Guests Served
