Life and Dignity of the Human Person

Every human life has value and dignity. A moral society protects life from conception until natural death. We must prevent attacks on human life, such as abortion, euthanasia, cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the death penalty. We cannot harm innocent life in war or terrorist attacks. We must seek peace and other methods to solve conflicts that promote human life.



Call to Family, Community, and Participation



People are social beings. How we organize our society's economy, politics, law, and policies affects people's dignity and ability to grow. Marriage and family are key social institutions and we should support and strengthen them. People have a right and duty to participate in society. We should all seek the common good to ensure the well being of all members, especially people who are poor and vulnerable.

Rights and Responsibilities

A healthy community protects human dignity and human rights. Every person has a right to life and the things needed to live decent lives like food, clothing, shelter, and education. These rights come with responsibilities too. We have a responsibility to help each other, our families, and our community so that everyone's rights are protected.
